JOB TITLE: RN Team Leader

Summary of Responsibilities

Supervises and administers nursing services to residents on an assigned team; oversees the dispensing of and administers medicines and treatments to residents; directs personal care of residents; monitors, reports and records residents progress.

Illustrative Examples of Work

- 1. Supervises, evaluates and updates personnel assigned to team; delegates tasks to staff; prepares CNA and Unit Attendant assignments; maintains record of unit employee attendance; disciplines staff when necessary.
- 2. Administers medications and treatments to residents; administer intravenous injections, feedings, etc.; checks and administers narcotics.
- 3. Maintains accurate patient reports and charts; reports daily on patient transactions to relieving shifts.
- 4. Assists physician in conducting unit rounds; reports resident's symptoms and condition to physician; notifies physician in case of emergency; obtains, transcribes and carries out physician orders.
- 5. Gives direct patient care which cannot be carried out by nonprofessional personnel; gives assistance to CNA or Unit Attendant when necessary.
- 6. May be required to serve in capacity as House Supervisor.
- 7. Conducts meetings with staff as necessary.
- 8. Attends fire and disaster drills, in-service training programs and a variety of required meetings, including supervisory meetings, safety meetings, etc.
- 9. Performs all duties in accordance with County policies and procedures.
- 10. Performs other duties as required or assigned.

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Education and Experience

- Certification of graduation from an accredited school of nursing.
- Current registration with the Illinois State Board of Nurse Examiners.
- Extensive knowledge of nursing theory and practice.
- Extensive knowledge of applicable Federal, State and Local requirements for a skilled care nursing home.

Abilities

- Ability to deal effectively with geriatric and multiple-handicapped persons.
- Ability to supervise nursing care personnel.
- Ability to communicate effectively both oral and in writing in all situations.
- Ability to function effectively in an emergency situation; maintain a composed manner of self and staff.
- Ability to establish and maintain working relationships with professional and non-professional personnel, patients and the general public.
